Obituary

Joyce Doris Malloy, was affectionately known as **Mommy Joyce** to her grandchildren, and Dippie to the rest of her family. She was born in Harlem, NY, on August 24, 1934, to Annie Mae Kollock and Daniel Malachai Malloy, and raised in Fort Greene, Brooklyn.

Living across the street from Cumberland Hospital inspired her to become a nurse. Joyce was exceptionally bright and graduated from Freedmen's Hospital School of Nursing (Howard University), where she received her Registered Nurse (RN) license. Continuing her education was very important to Joyce, obtaining both a bachelor's and master's degree in nursing from Adelphi University and New York University.

Joyce was very devoted to her nursing career. After spending several years as head clinician at Queens General Hospital, she was inspired to teach and mentor future nurses. She began teaching senior nursing students at Clara Barton High School. At Clara Barton Joyce was inspired to motivate the student to pursue higher education. Joyce was so inspirational that she inspired her niece Penni Malloy, great niece Cheriese Williams and granddaughter Chioma Brown to become Registered Nurses.

She was such an excellent motivator, that Joyce was recruited as a guidance counselor at The School for Pregnant Teens in Jamaica, Queens, where she stayed until retirement. After retirement, she never slowed down, she worked at Thomas Edison High School doing high school placements and transfers for the New York City Board of Education. She also did substitute nursing in the school system and worked at the voting polls in Baldwin, Long Island during the elections.

Joyce was a very active member of Chi Eta Phi nursing sorority and, along with several members of her Chapter, traveled to Senegal, West Africa, in the early 1990's to adopt a village and provide them with medical supplies and nursing advice to improve the healthcare in that region. Joyce was an active member of The Greater Allen A.M.E Cathedral of New York in Queens.

After showing advanced signs of dementia, benevolence, caring, and self-sacrifice were exhibited by her oldest daughter Wendi, who took on the responsibility of caring for her and Lori's three children.

Joyce loved art, music, travel, and the simplicities of life. Joyce will be missed by many, but she will be known in the presence of God that she did her share in showing her family, students, and friends that anything is possible if you believe.

As part of her lasting legacy of love, she leaves to cherish two daughters, Wendi Joy Toomer and Carla Khadijah Aniagoh; her son Charles Toomer; twelve grandchildren, nine great-grandchildren; a sister, Honorable Judge Rosalind Malloy and, Dr. Tyrone Malloy. She has a host of grandchildren, great children, nieces, nephews, great grandnieces and grand nephews and cousins who will cherish the memories they shared. She was predeceased by her daughter Lori, her oldest sister Anne Malloy Thomas, and brothers Daniel and Marcus Malloy.
