Obituary

William Charles Adams, Jr. was born on May 28, 1927 at 221 West 141st Street, Harlem, New York. He received first holy communion at the age of 10 in 1937 at St. Mary's American Catholic Church at 189 Lenox Avenue, NYC.

William attended the New York City Public School system. First at Public School 157 at 126th Street & St. Nicholas Avenue, where he graduated in 1939 with high grades and an aptitude for math. Then in 1942, he graduated from Junior High School 184 at West 116th Street between Lenox and Fifth Ave. There his main course was Spanish. Next he went on to Commerce High School at 55 West 65th Street, where he focused on bookkeeping, accounting and typing and which he left 6 credits short of graduation to help at home. Not one to easily give-up, he went back to evening school at Wadleigh Evening School between November 1944 to June 1945 attending two to three nights per week.

Also in 1945, he started working in the garment district where he packed and delivered dresses and sometimes did some porter work when things were slow. He quickly rose up to become the Assistant Shipping Clerk due to his math skills. This was not an easily feasible task for a man of color to achieve in the 1950's. In those times, 'Help Wanted' signs read "Boy Wanted." William left the garment district in 1955 after 10 years, to pursue local employment. From then he was a man of 'numerology' with the Big Red & Big Blue...

He was proud of his extensive gospel records collection and to have been able to read through the entire Bible two and a half times as well as studied some other religions. Both Marcus Garvey and Father Devine were inspirations to him.
