Obituary

Mary Louise Cabbell (nee Jenkins), aged 96, died on August 25, 2023 at her residence in Laurelton, New York. Mary was born on March 29, 1927 to Lawrence and Fredia Lee Jenkins (Smith). Mary and her sister Idabelle were raised in Orlando, Florida. After graduating from Jones High School, she continued her education at Hampton Institute (now Hampton University) and at the Medical College of Virginia's St. Phillip School of Nursing in Richmond, Virginia. At St. Philip, she became lifelong friends with Lois Carter Teele, Bessie Kirkley and Mary Fugate. After graduation in 1949, the quartet moved to New York City to embark on their nursing careers.

Mary met her future husband, Frederick Cabbell, Sr., while caring for his sister Nanny Ogburn at Brooklyn Jewish Hospital. Mary and Frederick were married in 1954, and their union was blessed with two sons. They settled in Laurelton where they enjoyed entertaining friends and family. Mary was supportive of her sons' involvement in many sports, including karate, baseball, and football. She was active in many community organizations and was proud of her service as president of the PTA at P.S. 176. After forty-three years of practice, Mary retired from nursing in 1988, shortly after the death of her husband.

Mary was predeceased by her parents, her sister, her husband and her friends Lois, Bessie and Mary. She is survived by her sons: Frederick Cabbell, Jr. (Patricia) of Chestnut Ridge, New York, and Dr. Kyle Cabbell (Diane) of Greensboro, North Carolina; five beloved grandchildren: Darnell, Nicolette, Travis, Samantha and Ava; nieces Elvarie Vaughn, Mary Cobb and Brenda Dorsett; and a host of grandnieces, grandnephews and friends.
