# Obituary

Compton Tudor was born to Eric and Maefield Tudor in MacKenzie, Upper Demerara River, Guyana on August 20th 1947. He was the 2nd of 9 children. He is survived by his siblings: Sister Yvonne, Brenda, Juliette, Joyce, Colin and Royston. His siblings that predeceased him were Edwin and Desiree.

Desiree was the matmaker for Compton and Patricia. Compton, as everyone called him, was a curious, bright child. He was always opening up his toys, either to see how they worked or to try and improve their mechanism. At age 12, Compton passed the entrance examination to attend one of Guyana's top schools - McKenzie High School from which he graduated with distinction. Upon his graduation, in the early 1960's, he began teaching at the elementary school that he had attended - St.Aidan's Anglican School in Wismar.

Ever the adventurous soul, in the mid-sixties, Compton moved to the capital city of Georgetown and began teaching once again. This time, he was at a government- run school on the West Bank of Demerara. But teaching did not fulfill his desire to be all he could be, and he left this occupation to become an insurance representative. One would think that this was going to be his final decision for life. However, he left this job and worked for a short spell with the Government Geological Department before relocating to his hometown. There he secured a job with the Demerara Bauxite Company (Demba) where he was awarded a scholarship to attend the University of Guyana. Compton, the adventurous, rode his motorcycle almost seventy miles from the Bauxite town to Turkey to attend classes. His adventurous spirit always seemed to beckon him. He moved to Trinidad and Tobago in the mid - eighties then on to the United States. Those early years of experimenting and creating seemed to have influenced him into construction. This was his final occupation of which he took great pride.

Compton leaves to mourn his wife, Patricia; his children Karen, Junior, Marlon, Minella and Paul, his six grandchildren, Stephan, Diamond and Josanne of Trinidad and John, Adalia and Esther of the USA; sister in laws, Donna, Ervlin and others, his cousins - the Griffiths, the Bonds, the Stephens, the Daymons; nieces and nephews, great nieces and nephews too numerous to mention.

Compton will surely be missed by his wife Patricia, his family and friends but will remain forever in our hearts.
