Jonell Elveter Harris, 70, passed away peacefully on August 10, 2024. Born on October 24, 1953, in Rock Hill, South Carolina, Jonell was the cherished only child of Richard and Margie Ray Brown.

Sadly, Jonell was widowed in November 1984.

Her career as a dedicated nurse spanned 30 years at Roosevelt Hospital in Edison, New Jersey. In 1996, she was honored as one of the top 100 nurses in the state of New Jersey, recognized for her leadership, compassion, and commitment to patient care.

Known affectionately as "Mommy" by many, Jonell was the heart of her community. She opened her home and heart to everyone, embodying the spirit of a true neighborhood mom. Her love for her family and friends was boundless, and she fiercely protected those she loved.
