

His eldest son, Jonah Jr., reminisced when his daddy would pack up the blue Buick station wagon with everyone inside, load lots of food, and take them to Riverside Park for fun. A fond memory of his daughter Nicol is when her daddy taught her how to put accessories on her bike and change a tire for her to be more independent.

Jonah Earl Perry, Sr.'s legacy will continue through his children, Jonah Earl Perry, Jr. (Trina) and Nicol Perry; his grandchildren, Kashane Hamilton and Jonah Perry III; bonus grandchild, Jayla; and his godson, Frankie Tyner.
