Obituary

Euphemia Richman, lovingly known as "Girlie," was born on November 2, 1933, in Frank Hall, St. Ann Parish, Jamaica, West Indies. She was the daughter of the late Joselyn and Doris (Peart) Green. As the fourth child in a vibrant family of nine, she brought joy and laughter to her two sisters and six brothers, leaving an indelible mark on their lives.

At the tender age of three months, Euphemia was embraced by her devoted aunt, Mary Green, who welcomed her into her home in Kingston. There, she flourished in her studies at Allman Town Primary School and later at Kingston Senior Secondary School. Her dedication and passion for learning paved the way for a rewarding career at St. Hugh's High School, where she served in the school lab for over 20 years, nurturing countless young minds.

In a beautiful twist of fate, Euphemia met the charming Kenneth Richman, and on April 23, 1958, they united in holy matrimony. This loving partnership blessed them with seven wonderful children, and Euphemia embraced her role as the family matriarch with grace and devotion, exemplifying the ideals of a loving wife and nurturing mother.

In June 1977, Euphemia embarked on a new chapter of her life, migrating to the United States and settling in Paterson, NJ, in pursuit of better opportunities for her family. For over 36 years, she dedicated herself to her work as a Visiting Homemaker, providing compassionate care and support to those in need until her health necessitated a well-deserved rest.

Euphemia found profound solace and strength in her faith as a cherished member of the Church of Jesus Christ (Apostolic) in Paterson, NJ, under the guidance of the late Apostle, Bishop R.C. Williams. She joyfully served on the Senior Choir and held the esteemed position as a Missionary and was once the President of the Women's Department. Her unwavering commitment to her church was evident

as she faithfully penned the Scriptures of the Week each month. Euphemia remained an integral part of her church community until she was called home peacefully on Monday, September 16, 2024—a poignant date that also marks the passing of her beloved younger brother, Rev. Wesley Green, in 2011. Euphemia was also a member of the Jamaica Organization of New Jersey (JONJ) for several years.

At the age of 90, Euphemia's earthly journey came to a close. She is predeceased by her beloved parents, Joselyn and Doris Green; her cherished son, Daniel Richman; her sisters, Mildie Beckford and Rona Barrett; her brothers, Rafael, Clarence, Kenneth, and Selvin Green; her grandson, Ackeen Richman.
