Julio César Nolasco, affectionately called "July" by his family, was born on June 6, 1953 in Castillo, Duarte Province, Dominican Republic. His parents were Tomásina Hernández Rojas and Ramón Antonio Nolasco. Julio was the firstborn of his parents. His sisters are Nuris E. Nolasco and Ana Zeneida Nolasco. He also has paternal siblings in Miledys, Jannette, and Raymond Nolasco Jr.

Julio lost his mother when he was only 7 years old. Then his father immigrated to the United States to support the family financially from there. Julio and his sisters Nuris and Zeneida were raised under the guardianship of their aunt Mercedes Hernández Rojas with the support of their father from the United States. On November 29, 1973, Julio, at the age of 20, also immigrated to the United States, and immediately, with his father's impetus, began a career in the hotel industry in New York that would last 46 years. He first worked at the Hotel Piccadilly, NYC where the famous New York Marriott Marguis is now located in the heart of Manhattan (W. 45 Street and Broadway). He then worked at the Travel Inn Hotel located at West 42 Street and 10th Ávenue. During his career in hotels he performed various trades such as a cleaning and maintenance worker, as a security agent, as a supervisor on duty, and was also a trusted man of the hotel owner for which he worked. He was entrusted with the care of a private yacht on the Boat Basin Circle (West 79 Street and Henry Hudson Parkway) and also with the care of private homes in Manhattan (West 86 Street) and in the prestigious Hamptons on Long Island. That confidence shows the caliber of a man that Julio was, responsible and dedicated to everything he was entrusted to.

Julio's best quality as a human being was his nobleness. Kind, sincere, and humble. Funny, gentle, and friendly. He was constant. He was easy to love! Julio did not have children begotten by him but nevertheless, he has children that he fostered based on affection, love, and firmness. His children are (his nephews): Abraham Jr. and Lorena, Jarilee and Heriberto, Amanda and John. His grandchildren are Sebastian, Skylar, and Stella. Also his children include Mervin, Jerry and Tanisha and his grandson Christopher.

Another example of the firmness that Julio embodied was the relationship with his life partner, Miriam Martha Pacheco. For 47 years he was a monument of devotion and dedication.
