Mother Una Bernard was born on March 1, 1932, in Jamaica, West Indies. She migrated to the United States in 1967. She immediately began to further her education in the medical field and graduated in 1969. She began her career in the health profession in 1970 as a nursing assistant in the GYN clinic at Jacobi Hospital and retired after 30 years of service.

Mother Bernard received the gift of the Holy Ghost in 1964 in Jamaica, West Indies. When she migrated to the United States, she became a member of the Greater Refuge Temple, New York City in 1968. During her years of membership at the Greater Refuge Temple, Mother Bernard served in several capacities, namely: member of the Gospel Chorus and President for two years, member of the Young Women for Christ, member of the Unlicensed Missionaries and Assistant Vice President, licensed Senior Missionary for over forty years, and a captain of the Senior Missionary Board for fourteen years. Because of her tenure as a Senior Missionary, Mother Bernard was inducted into the Apostolic Gallery for Excellent Services (A.G.E.S.) in 2016. On Sunday, October 6, 2024, Mother Bernard was given the high honor of being consecrated and inducted into the Mother's Board of the Greater Refuge Temple, New York. Mother Bernard served the International Women's Council as Chaplain for four years under the leadership of Mother Susie N. McCoy.

In response to the Great Commission, Mother Bernard extended herself to several mission fields globally. She visited Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, St Croix, St. Lucia, Trinidad, West Indies, and Jerusalem.

As a 'people person,' she became interested in the Senior Recreational Program in her community. Mother Bernard served as the Assistant Secretary and Vice President of the East New York Interagency Council on the Aging, Inc.

Mother Bernard was given to great hospitality. She welcomed her family, friends, and the saints into her home. She enjoyed preparing and sharing delicious meals with them. She was a gloating grandmother and great grandmother whenever the opportunity arose. Her neighbors thought very highly of her generous spirit. She loved to praise the Lord.

Mother Bernard was a woman of prayer with a heart and compassion for souls. Her favorite Scripture was Psalm 34. In her own words, *Mother Bernard advised: "If the Lord directs you to a church, why look for another church?"*
