Esther Lounetta Scott was born in New York City on July 20, 1957, to the late Azzie Scott and James Wallace. She received her early education in the New York City Public School system and later obtained her high school equivalency diploma from the Educational Opportunity Center (EOC) at the Harlem State Office Building.

Her passion for doing hair began at a very young age, a love she inherited from her mother. In 1984, she pursued this passion by enrolling in **Wilfred Beauty Academy**, where she earned her Cosmetology license. She worked as a hairstylist for a few years after obtaining her license, but eventually decided to explore other career opportunities. In 1992, she joined the New York City Department of Transportation, and within a few years, she was promoted to Office Manager, a role she held until her passing.

On February 24, 2025, Esther went to be with the Lord to join her mother Azzie, her grandson Geonny, her sisters Ruth, Robin, and Cassandra, her brothers James "Rudy", Tyrone, James "Stephon", nephew David and niece Tamika.

As a young girl, Esther loved doing hair and dressing up. She loved helping anyone get ready for any affair, whether it was doing their hair or helping them shop for or put together an outfit. Anyone who knew Esther knew she loved to shop, adored clothes and glasses, and especially loved hats. She wore plenty of them in more ways than one. She was a mother, grandmother, sister, aunt, cousin, and friend, and she wore these hats well. If she was any of these to you, you could truly believe she was loyal, non-judgmental, and someone you could depend on, who would keep secrets entrusted to her. If she loved you, you knew it—even if she had to curse you out on occasion (and she would curse you out). Betrayal was unacceptable to her, and for that reason, she would cut you off completely.

Esther never married, but she had three amazing children: Eboni, Patrece, and Chazz, who were the wind beneath her wings. Nothing meant as much or more to her than her grandchildren and God. She loved being a mother, but those grandchildren were a whole different world for her. She wanted them to know her and make sure they knew she was there for them (though they could also get lovingly cursed out for doing the wrong thing). God kept her grounded, and she woke up every morning thanking Him for all she had.

Esther had a great sense of humor. She joked with everyone and had a way of making you laugh, even during some of your toughest times. She loved poetry and music, especially oldies.
